The development train stopped at the Asuogyaman district in the eastern region in February 2021.

The Girls coaching clinic took place on the 3rd to 5th February, 2021 respectively from am to 2:30pm to 5:30pm each day. Whereas the Boys'clinic took place on 10th to 12th February, 2021

Anum CC, Pupuni CC, Frankadua CC, Boso CC, Senchi Maidens CC, Senchi Fire Balls CC, Tortibor CC were the clubs at the clinic.

7 communities were brought together on two separate occasions – girls' cricket & boys' cricket.

The communities are: Boso, Anum, Frankadua, Tortibu, Mangoase, Senchi and Pupuni

The aim was to recap on basics of cricket.

Bowling, Batting and Fielding simultaneously. 5mins of introduction and demonstration by coaches at each station with 20mins allocated time for participants to do repetitions before rotation occurs.

Coaches add competitions randomly to keep the participants engaged consistently like target bowling by bowlers, ball striking by batters and running between wickets with demarcated cones to accumulate runs and fielders catching most with both hands and one hand.
